Requirements for the Digital Badgemaker Badge

- Select a topic for which you would like to issue a digital/open badge.
- Use Openbadges.me or another program or website to create artwork to represent your digital badge.
- Use badg.us or [Penn State's "L3" badging system](#) to create your digital badge.
- Award the badge you created to yourself.
- Award the badge to at least two other people.
- Earn badges made by at least two other people.
- Create an account with [Mozilla Open Badges](#).
- Transport at least three earned badges to your Mozilla "Badge Backpack."

Submit evidence that you have completed the steps above. (Consider issuing the badge you created to Dr. Peck as evidence, and sending him a screenshot of your Mozilla backpack or a link to a collection in your backpack as evidence of the badges you have earned.)

The badge I created was the Berkey Creamery Taster-Final badge. I created it on the PSU L3 Badging system. It is the one marked – Final. I tried creating it the first time and listing all the flavors and the history, etc however I did not like the way it looked when it was completed. The system does not allow for bullets or spaces in the description. And the system also does not allow for the deletion or editing of a badge once it is created. These are definitely areas that need to be improved upon going forward.

There are three requirements for the badge and they are as follows:

1) Step 1 – Taste a Flavor

Evidence: The participant has to upload a brief paragraph describing which flavor they tried and what their thoughts were on the flavor.

2) Step 2 – Picture Fun

Evidence: The participant has to upload a selfie of them enjoying creamery ice cream

3) Step 3 – Recommend a Flavor

Evidence: The participant has to upload a paragraph recommending a flavor and giving it a creative name.
